



# MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

More Tours, More Exhibits, More Events

In the past year, volunteers and staff have expanded their repertoires to include Rosson House express tours for our busiest times of year (which we seem to have more of all the time). Our VIP tours changed to include the very popular Victorian Secrets Unmentionable Tour, and the Rosson House Restored Tour, along with curator talks for exhibits. Celebrate the Holidays décor was a hit, and we sold close to 400 tickets for the Holiday Teas! Plate Expectations: Victorian Dining, Decorum

& Dishes, debuted in February 2018, showcasing pieces of our collection that usually languish in dark cupboards. And, coming this summer, our new exhibit *You are Here: Mapping Early Phoenix*, created in conjunction with the Maricopa County Recorders Office will go live in the Stevens-Haustgen Bungalow.

We added vendors and provided booths to partners for our Motoring Through Time & Heritage Festival this year, and celebrated our most successful event to date, with over 2,500 visitors. As we are gearing up for our fourth Gin & Jazz Preservation Party this year, we do so with more funding and community interest than ever.

Handcrafted workshops are bringing new local audiences to the Square, and have seen many come for repeat visits. We've showcased some amazing speakers, gone on field trips, and even started a Summer Camp for Grown-ups!

### **MAP**

This year, with help from staff, board members, and volunteers, we completed a Museum Assessment Project, courtesy of the Alliance of American Museums (AAM) and Institute of Museum & Library Services (IMLS). The peer-review site visit introduced us to John Sherrer, who evaluated our operations and injected tons of ideas for growing the organization and strengthening our role as a cultural leader for Phoenix and the surrounding Valley.

### **Extended City Agreement**

Our Board deserves major kudos this year for successfully negotiating a 5-year extension of our operating agreement with the City of Phoenix. This extension secures our partnerships to manage the Park until 2027, making the partnership between the Foundation and Parks & Rec the oldest such agreement in the City.
